4. General Information

4.1. Country and City

4.1.1. China

The People's Republic of China (hereinafter referred to as "China"), founded on 1 October 1949, is located in the east of Asia and on the western shore of the Pacific Ocean, covering a land area of about 9.6 million km², with over 18,000 km coastlines in the east and south, and 4.73 million km² of inland and marginal sea. It has 7,600 islands in varying sizes its border line is about 22 thousand kilometres. China has 34 provincial-level administrative regions, and its capital city is Beijing. China, together with the United States, Russia, France and the United Kingdom, are permanent members of the UN Security Council. Though there have always been many ethnic groups, China is famous for the harmonious coexistence. China respects and protects the freedom of religious belief. The prevalent religions practised in China include Buddhism, Taoism, Islam, Catholicism and Christianity. Since the founding of the People's Republic of China, the peace-loving Chinese people have been dedicated to economic and social development. Over the years, as the country becomes increasingly prosperous, people's livelihoods have been improved. Sports have seen an extensive development as well. Nationwide fitness programmes are flourishing and historic

breakthroughs have been made in competitive sports. Chinese mainland has successfully hosted many international multi-sport games, including Beijing 2001 Summer Universiade, Beijing 2008 Olympic Games, Shenzhen 2011 Summer Universiade and 2022 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games.

China always safeguards world peace, contributes to global development, upholds international order, and stays committed to pushing forward the building of a community with a shared future for mankind. The Chinese are willing to work with people from all other countries and regions to make greater contributions to world peace and development.

4.1.2. Sichuan

Sichuan is a province hailed as the 'Land of Abundance' in Southwest China and sits on the upper reaches of the Yangtze River. It covers an area of 486,000 km² and has a permanent resident population of more than 83 million.

Boasting a long history, Sichuan is the cradle of ancient Shu civilisation, and the place where 'Jiaozi'—the earliest banknote in the world—was born. Sichuan Brocade and Sichuan Shadow Play have been included in UNESCO's list of intangible cultural heritage. Particularly the sites of the Sanxingdui Ruins and the Jinsha Ruins epitomise the resplendent and mysterious civilisation of ancient Sichuan.

The province has 26 world-class tourist attractions and brands, hosting three a number of UNESCO World Natural Heritage sites including Jiuzhaigou Valley and Huanglong Scenic and Historic Interest Areas and Sichuan Giant Panda Sanctuaries, the World Cultural Heritage site Mount Qingcheng and the Dujiangyan Irrigation System, and the World Cultural and Natural Heritage site Mount Emei Scenic Area and Leshan Giant Buddha Scenic Area.

As a transportation hub in Southwest China, Sichuan has two international airports, namely Chengdu Tianfu International Airport and Chengdu Shuangliu International Airport. It is home to 23,900 schools of all types at all levels, including 134 colleges and universities, attracting 377 Fortune 500 enterprises setting up their offices here.

4.1.3. Chengdu

As the hometown of giant pandas, Chengdu enjoys over 4,500 years of civilisation history and more than 2,300 years of history as a city, manifesting a perfect mixture of history, culture and modernity. Being the capital of Sichuan Province and a National Central City, Chengdu covers an area of 14,300 km² and has a permanent population of over 21 million, which has turned it into a mega city known to the world. It is also an important centre of economy, science and technology, finance, cultural creativity, and international exchanges in China, and an international hub for comprehensive transportation and communications.

Today's Chengdu values opening up with global vision. More than 20 countries have been approved to establish consulates in Chengdu. And the city has established sister-city and friendship city relations with more than 100 cities around the world, and trade relations with over 200 countries or regions worldwide. Chengdu is the third city having two international airports on the Chinese mainland, following Shanghai and Beijing, and the 19th city with two 4F airports in the world. It has opened over 130 international/regional passenger and freight flight routes and has international freight trains reaching more than 60 cities around the globe.

Chengdu has been awarded as the City of Gastronomy by UNESCO for its world-renowned Sichuan cuisine, great variety of delicious street food, and tasty spicy hotpot. It is also one

China's Best Tourist City selected by UNWTO. Tianfu culture, the bedrock of Chengdu's city culture, has been nourishing the people and the city with the spirits of valuing innovation, creativity, elegance, fashion, optimism, inclusiveness, friendship and public welfare. Chengdu has won the bids to host large international events including the 81st World Science Fiction Convention, the 2024 Thomas & Uber Cups, the International Horticultural Exhibition 2024 Chengdu China and the 2025 World Games. Culture and sports have become the two focal points as Chengdu is going global in a more open and confident manner.

4.1.4. Climate and Weather Information

4.1.4.1. Climate

Located in the Sichuan basin, Chengdu has a humid sub-tropical monsoon climate characterised by mild weather with no extreme heat during the summer, no severe cold during the winter, plenty of precipitation during the autumn and at night, low wind speeds and high humidity. Its average annual temperature is 16.7 °C . Its average annual precipitation is 948.6mm, and its average annual humidity is 80%.

4.1.4.2. Weather in Late July and Early August

The period between late July and early August is the hottest period of the year. It comes with abundant precipitation and high humidity. The average wind speeds are relatively low and the visibility is high, despite the occasional occurrence of severe convective weather.

4.1.4.2.1. Temperature

The average temperature is 26.3°C in late July and 26.2°C in early August, and the difference between day and night is

about 9°C. The temperature is relatively stable, with the highest temperatures during the day ranging from 31°C to 39°C. There are on average two days and at most 14 days with a temperature higher than 35°C during this period.

4.1.4.2.2. Precipitation

With an average rainfall of 166.0mm, this period has more rain than other months. It mostly rains at night and only for a short duration of about 1-3 hours in the daytime.

4.1.4.2.3. Relative humidity

The average humidity between late July and early August is 82.6%, minimum 37% and maximum 100%.

4.1.4.2.4. Wind

There is often wind-free or very low wind speeds from late July to early August, with an average wind speed of 1.2 m/s. Northerly wind or northeasterly wind prevails, with the lowest wind speeds from the wee hours to 8 am. Winds gather speed at noon and slow down in the evening. Convective gusts occur occasionally with a usually very short duration of one hour.

4.1.4.2.5 Visibility

The period from late July to early August has high visibility and little fog. The average horizontal visibility is 26.2km, with a highest visibility of 50km and a lowest visibility of 5.0km.

5. Service Information

5.1. Arrival and Departure

- a. All overseas client groups can enter and exit China via Chengdu Shuangliu International Airport and Chengdu Tianfu International Airport, which are two official ports of entry. Chengdu Shuangliu International Airport, Chengdu Tianfu International Airport and Chengdudong Railway Station are set as the official points of arrival and departure with service desks where the arrival & departure staff of the Chengdu 2021 FISU Games will guide and assist the Customs clearance. Transportation services are available from the points of arrival and departure to the residence.
- b. All client groups should submit the arrival and departure information in a timely manner to ensure the convenient and efficient arrival and departure services. According to the requirements of the Organising Committee of the Chengdu 2021 FISU Games, all client groups should submit the arrival and departure information to the Organising Committee via FISU Online Accreditation System (OAS) at least one month before the opening ceremony. In case of any change, please modify the information in time within 48 hours before departure through the Delegation Attaché or the corresponding department.

5.2. FISU Games Village

5.2.1. Overview

The FISU Games Village is located on the campus of Chengdu University in east downtown Chengdu, taking up approximately 800,000 square metres. It is 46 kilometres northwest of Chengdu Tianfu International Airport, 26 kilometres northeast of Chengdu Shuangliu International Airport and 12 kilometres south of Dong'an Lake Sports Park Stadium. It is 42 kilometres from the nearest competition venue for Athletics -- Shuangliu Sports Centre Stadium. The FISU Games Village will open and accept check-in on 22 July 2023, and will close on 11 August 2023, operating for a total of 20 days. Both 5G and Wi-Fi are available across the village. The FISU Games Village consists of the operational zone, an international zone, a residential zone and transportation areas.

5.2.2. Operational Zone

The operational zone includes the following: the Welcome Centre, Village Pass Centre and Accreditation Centre. Bank services are provided in the Welcome Centre, where a waiting area with drinks and snacks is set.

5.2.3. International Zone

The international zone serves as an important communication platform for delegations. It includes the following facilities: flag plaza, Main Information Centre, Sport Information Centre, FISU Office and meeting rooms, polyclinic, doping control station, volleyball courts, basketball courts, athletic field, swimming pool,

post office, mobile services, tourist information services, barber shop, dry cleaner, licensed product stores, souvenir stores, café, games room, internet café, religious centre, volunteer centre, education activities and exhibition centre, and cultural activities centre.

5.2.4. Residential Zone

The residential zone provides accommodation during delegations' stay in the FISU Games Village. It consists of Zone A in the west, Zone B in the north and Zone C in the east (see the red zones in the FISU Games Village Map). All three zones have access to the international zone. There is also the Resident Services Centre, delegation offices, medical rooms and laundry rooms in the residential zone. If you need bed extensions, please register at the Resident Services Centre.

5.2.5. Transportation Areas

The transportation areas provide transportation services for delegations to and from competition and training venues and activity sites.

5.3.2. Important info

A personalized accreditation card with a photo, name and function of the cardholder carries information about the access

rights and privileges available to him/her. Upon arrival, the accreditation card enables members of delegations a 24-hour temporary access to the Chengdu 2021 FISU Games venues in accordance with the access rights on the accreditation card. The temporary access does not allow participation in the competition. After CIC's approval, the accreditation card will be fully activated.

5.4. Transportation

5.4.1. Transportation for Competition and Training of Athletes and Delegation Officials

-Shuttle bus (Competition)

The OC will arrange the shuttle bus timetable according to the competition schedule, provide shuttle service between the FISU Games Village and competition venues.

The schedule of the shuttle bus will reserve warm-up time upon arrival at the competition venue for athletes. Athletes and team officials can board the shuttle bus at the bus station located in the FISU Games Village.

In circumstance that athletes and team officials miss the last bus departing from the competition venue after the game due to doping testing, press conferences or other external reasons, the executive committee will arrange vehicles to transport athletes and team officials back to FISU Games Village from case to case.

-Shuttle bus (Training)

The executive committee will arrange the shuttle bus timetable according to the training schedule, provide shuttle service between the FISU Games Village and the training venue on a regular frequency. Athletes can board the shuttle bus at the bus station located in the FISU Games Village.

5.4.2. Transportation for Opening and Closing Ceremonies

The Opening Ceremony will be held at Dong'an Lake Sports Park Stadium, about 20 minutes' drive from the FISU Games Village while the Closing Ceremony will be held at Chengdu Open Air Music Park, about 25 minutes' drive from the FISU Games Village.

The Organising Committee will provide dedicated bus services for athletes and delegation officials to and from the FISU Games Village and the venues for the Opening Ceremony and the Closing Ceremony on 28 July and 8 August 2023 respectively.

Before the Opening/Closing Ceremony, the Organising Committee will assign vehicles transporting delegations to the opening/closing ceremony venue by delegations. The transportation information, including the pick-up time, vehicle details and pick-up point, shall be communicated at the daily HoD Meeting, two days before the event. All delegations are required to go through security check and arrive at the pick-up point 15 minutes before the pick-up time.

After the Opening/Closing Ceremony, delegations going back to the FISU Games Village will be picked up at the designated points in the Opening/Closing Ceremony Venue. The delegation members may take any bus with unoccupied seats. A bus will depart once it is full. Please refer to the Transportation Manual for the pick-up points after the ceremonies.

5.4.3. Transportation for Spectators

For athletes who want to watch the competition of any individual sport, they can take the scheduled shuttle buses to the competition venue of that sport. The Organising Committee will also provide shuttle bus services for spectating athletes to and from the Chengdu 2021 FISU World University Games Village and the venues of team sports. The athletes will be picked up

at the Shuttle Bus Station in the Village and dropped off in the venues. They can enter the venue with their accreditation cards or tickets.

5.4.4. Delegation Cars

- Assignment and use

Delegation cars with drivers will be provided for the athletes and officials of each delegation according to the delegation size on the principles specified in the following table:

After the athletes and delegation officials collect their accreditation cards in the FISU Games Village, the HoD or his/her designated personnel can sign the vehicle use agreement at the Transportation desk, in the Main Information Centre. Upon the signing of the agreement, the delegation will be entitled to use the delegation cars.

The liaison of a delegation will be informed of such vehicle details as the license plate number, parking position and driver's contact for the convenience of athletes and delegation officials to make reservations.

- Service Policy

The delegation cars will be available between 07:00 and 23:00 from 22 July to 10 August 2023. The athletes and delegation officials requesting the delegation cars should make reservations three hours in advance via the delegation liaison or by filling in the transportation information on the 2021 FISU World University Games Transportation APP. The delegation cars should only be used within the service hours.

Only the drivers assigned by the transportation service provider are allowed to drive the delegation cars.

5.5. Food and Beverages



5.5.1. Main Dining Hall

Athletes dining hall No. 1 and No. 2 are respectively located near the residential area A and C of the FISU Games Village, with a total floor area of 17,000 square meters. A total of 4,340 seats are available in the dining halls with a separate halal kitchen and dining area. The hours of operation are as follows:

This timetable is subject to changes.

Accreditation cards with  symbol give unlimited access to the athletes' dining halls. Otherwise, a valid voucher will be required to access the dining halls. If there is no  symbol on the

accreditation card, then no food is allowed to be taken out of the dining halls unless otherwise specified.

5.5.2. Menu

The athletes' dining halls offer hot dishes including Chengdu, Mediterranean, Continental, Asian and Halal cuisines. The menu of hot meals varies on a daily basis, with a rotation of seven days. Cold dishes, room temperature food, dishes cooked over open hearths and cold and hot drinks are available. Alcoholic drinks or fresh juice are not served in the dining halls.

Each dish is served with a food description card in Chinese and English.

5.6. Medical Care

5.6.1. Overview

City-wide medical resources are coordinated to establish a full-process medical service system integrating on-site treatment, emergency transfer, emergency treatment and inpatient treatment and covering all competition and training venues, the FISU Games Village, the Main Media Centre and official hotels to meet the needs of athletes, TOs, FISU Family, media, staff, and volunteers. The Polyclinic in the FISU Games Village provides 24-hour medical services.

5.6.2. Polyclinic

The Polyclinic consists of 16 departments and wards, including emergency, medicine, surgery, orthopaedics and traumatology, sport medicine, dermatology, gynaecology, stomatology, ENT (Ear, Nose and Throat), ophthalmology, imaging (CT, X-ray, colour ultrasound), electrocardiogram, iatrophysics and rehabilitation, a laboratory, a pharmacy and a fever and bowel clinic with isolation rooms. Medical services are provided by the medical staff of the Polyclinic. Medical services are available from 08:00 to 23:00 while first aid and emergency transfer services are available 24 hours a day.

On-site treatment and emergency transfer services are provided for all accredited personnel in the venues.

5.6.4. Designated Hospitals

The hospitals for the Games include nearby and referral hospitals. All of them have green channels and reserved beds to provide medical services for the accredited persons.

5.6.4.1. Nearby hospitals

Nearby hospitals are designated based on their distance to venues and the service capacities to provide medical services for the Games. In case of medical emergencies, athletes, other participants and staff will be transferred to the nearby hospitals for emergency treatment. Spectators will be transferred to the corresponding medical institutions via the urban public emergency system.

5.6.4.2. Referral hospitals

Referral hospitals will provide medical services for all client groups on patient-specific basis. If any client groups require further treatment as determined by the on-site medical point or the nearby hospital upon the preliminary diagnosis and treatment, they will be transferred to the corresponding referral hospitals.

5.7. Ticketing

Dedicating seating areas will be reserved for athletics athletes and technical officials at the competition venues. Athletics athletes and technical officials can enter these seating areas by presenting their accreditation cards. Different sport athletes and technical officials can make an appointment to reserve and collect game tickets in advance at the "Ticket Information Desk"

located in the FISU Games Village at a "first-come, first-served" policy.

5.8. Weather Forecast

From three days before the competition day until the end of the competition, weather forecast for the following 24 hours will be reported every day at 08:00 am, including the temperature, air pressure, relative humidity, wind speed, wind direction and precipitation.

6. Competition Information

6.1. Technical Committee

In accordance with Article 3.6.1 of the Regulations for the Chengdu 2021 FISU Games, a Technical Committee for Athletics will be set-up and consist of:

No more than two members of the Technical Committee should be of the same nationality, not including the FISU TCC.

6.2. Technical Regulations

6.2.1.

The athletics events will be organised in accordance with the latest World Athletics Competition and Technical Rules. In case of disagreement in the interpretation of these rules, the English text will be regarded as authoritative.

6.2.2.

The programme and duration of the competitions will be fixed by the FISU Executive Committee in agreement with the OC and the FISU World University Games Summer ITC. In principle, the programme shall last for six days and include the following events:

b. Relay Events:

a relay event: 1 team of maximum 4 athletes

- If a country/region entering a relay team has already entered 2 athletes or more in 100 / 200 m (in relation to 4x100m relay) or in 400m (in relation to 4x400m relay), the relay team can be filled in with a maximum of 2 relay specialists. For example: if 3 athletes are registered in 100/200m, only 2 additional athletes can be accepted for the relay event.
- If a country/region entering a relay team has entered 1 athlete or less in 100 / 200 m (in relation to 4x100m relay) or in 400m (in relation to 4x400m relay), the relay team may be filled up to a maximum of 4 athletes. For example: if 1 athlete is registered in 100/200m, 3 additional athletes can be accepted for the relay event.

c. Team Event:

A Team Event will be established for men and women in the 20km walk and half marathon events.

Each country/region is authorised to enter in:

- individual event: two (2) athletes both of whom have achieved the entry standard for the event from 1 January 2021 to the deadline of acceptance of Individual Entry Form or one athlete who has not achieved the entry standard;
 - relay event: one (1) team with maximum four (4) athletes for each event.
- If a country/region has already entered Two (2) athletes in the events of 100/200m (in relation to 4x100m relay) or 400m (in relation to 4x400m relay), it can only enter maximum of two (2) or more athletes for relay event only. For example: if three (3) athletes are entered in 100/200m, only two (2) additional athletes can be accepted for 4x100m relay entry.
 - If a country/region has entered one (1) athlete or less in the events of 100/200 m (in relation to 4x100m relay) or in 400m (in relation to 4x400m relay), its relay team may be filled up to a maximum of four (4) athletes. For example: if one (1) athlete is entered in 100/200m, three(3) additional athletes can be accepted for 4x100m relay entry.
- c. For men's and women's 10,000m events, a maximum of three

(3) athletes, all of whom have achieved the entry standard of that event from 1 January 2021 to the deadline of acceptance of Individual Entry Form or two (2) who have not achieved the entry standard.

d. For men's and women's half-marathon and 20km walk events.

- maximum of five (5) athletes, all of whom have achieved the entry standard of that event from 1 January 2021 to the deadline of acceptance of Individual Entry Form or three (3) who have not achieved the entry standard.

- Each delegation entering a race walk or half-marathon team events shall have a minimum of three (3) and maximum of five (5) athletes.

- The accumulation times (results) of the first three (3) finished athletes of each team shall determine the team ranking. The team with the shortest accumulation times (results) is the winner, and so on.

- A tie shall be resolved in favor of the team whose last scoring athlete finished with a shorter time.

- All finished athletes shall be ranked individually and shall be eligible for individual awards.

- A team with less than three finished athletes will not be ranked in the team result.

6.2.3.

No later than 12:00AM one (1) day prior the General Technical Meeting(29 July) the HoD or his/her representative shall confirm and sign the official lists of all athletes at the SIC in the FISU World University Games Village.

The final confirmation of each event for the first day's competition shall be made by the HoD or his/her representative no later than 12:00 AM on the day of the General Technical Meeting (29 July) at the SIC.The final confirmation for the remaining days'

competition shall be made no later than 09:00 AM one (1) day prior to the first round of each event at the SIC or the TIC located in the competition venue.

Any entry not duly confirmed will be invalid except for force majeure.

6.2.4. Entry Standards

The entry standards for all events should be achieved from 1 January 2021 to the deadline of acceptance of Individual Entry Form.

6.2.5. Advanced Payment

At least two months before the opening ceremony of the Chengdu 2021 FISU Games (i.e., by 28 May 2023), all delegations must confirm their participation with an advanced payment of 50% of the participation fee per entered athlete and official (calculation made based on the Entries numbers and six days of stay). It is strongly recommended that all participating delegations pay the remaining dues for the participation fees to the Executive Committee of Chengdu 2021 FISU Games ten days before the Opening Ceremony (i.e., by 18 July 2023). However, they may also pay such remaining dues upon their arrival at the FISU Games Village. Should an athlete compete, his/her advanced payment shall be credited to the remainder of the participation fees to be paid to the Executive Committee of Chengdu 2021 FISU Games.

6.3. Competition Format

The competition format will be outlined in the Final Version of the Technical Handbook to be published on 20 July 2023.

6.3.1. Track Events

The rounds of competition will be arranged in accordance with the World Athletics Rule 20 of Technical Rules (TR20) by applying the World Athletics Track Events rounds, heats and progression Tables, based on the number of participants after the closing date for entries.

6.3.2. Field Events

The Qualification Rounds shall be held if the number of participants is too Large to allow the competition to be conducted in a single round (final). The qualifying standards for the finals will be decided by the Technical Committee. If twelve (12) or more athletes have reached the qualifying standard, all of them will be in the Final. The qualifying standards as well as the starting height and subsequent raising heights of High Jump and Pole Vault will be announced at the General Technical Meeting.

6.3.3. Half Marathon

Athletes for Half Marathon shall run four (4) loops, and the distance indications will be displayed in kilometers.

Athletes shall report at the Call Room (near the start area) 30 minutes and arrive at starting line 10 minutes before the race start. Transponder Timing Chips will be distributed at the Call Room before the competition.

Retiring from the Race: Should an athlete be unable to continue the race due to physical difficulties, he/she must inform the nearest Competition Official, indicating that he/she would like to abandon the race. To properly indicate the retirement from the race, the athlete shall be asked to remove his/her bibs.

As shown on the course map (see Appendix “?”), there are Refreshment Stations every 5 km and drinking/Sponging Stations every 2.5 km along the course. In the Refreshment Stations the first and last Table will be placed with drinking water by the OC, and from the second Table will be the personal refreshment Tables.

Each team will have its own Table that will be marked with its national / regional flag and the FISU Member Federation Code (e.g. China = CHN). The Tables will be arranged in alphabetical order according to this code.

Personal refreshments must be taken to the Refreshment Stations directly by team officials. Transportation to the Refreshment Stations will be available, while leaving the start area 10 minutes prior to the start of the competition (06:50 AM on 6 August). For those athletes who do not have any team officials with them, bottles should be collected in the Call Room at least 30 minutes before the race start. The OC will provide bottles for personal refreshments and adhesive labels at the SIC. The athletes may also use their own bottles.

Team officials are permitted to hand over the personal refreshments to their athletes at the Refreshment Stations but are not allowed to leave the designated area to follow the athletes on the course. Two (2) officials from each delegation will have access to the Refreshment Station. The special passes to access the Refreshment Stations will be distributed at the TIC.

The OC will provide sealed bottles of non-refrigerated water on the first and last table at the Refreshment Station.

To obtain food, water, ice, etc. from the places other than the Refreshment Station and the Drinking / Sponging Stations is prohibited.

Toilets will be available at the end of the Refreshment Station and the Drinking / Sponging Station.

There shall be two mist stations along the course. The water is sprayed from above. The athletes may choose whether to use the mist stations at discretion.

First-aid stations and ambulances will be available at the start/finish areas and designed places on the course.

There are signs 100 meters in front of the Refreshment station, Drinking/Sponging station, Mist station, First-aid station, Toilet and every 5km Timing point.

6.3.4. 20km Walk

The start/finish line of 20km Walk is the same as that of Half Marathon. The course is a 1km loop and athletes need to walk 20 loops.

Athletes shall be present at the Call Room (near the start area) no less than 30 minutes and arrive at starting line 10 minutes before the race start. Transponder Timing Chips will be distributed at the Call Room before the competition.

Disqualification: Should the Chief Judge or a Chief Judge's Assistant inform an athlete of his/her disqualification, the disqualified athlete is required to leave the course immediately, bibs and transponder chips removed, and to directly go to the Post Event Control Center.

Electronic posting boards displaying the red cards and disqualifications will be placed beside the course.

Retiring from the Race: Should an athlete be unable to continue the race due to physical difficulties, he/she must inform the nearest Competition Official, indicating that he/she would like to

abandon the race. In order to properly indicate the intention of retirement from the race, the athlete is asked to remove his/ her bibs.

As indicated on the course map (see Appendix “?”), there is one Refreshment Station and one Drinking / Sponging Station for each loop. In the Refreshment Station the first and last Table will be placed with drinking water by the OC, and from the second Table will be the personal refreshment Tables. Each team will have its own Table that will be marked with its national/regional flag and the FISU Member Federation Code (e.g. China = CHN). The Tables will be arranged in alphabetical order according to this code. Personal refreshments must be taken to the Refreshment Stations directly by team officials. The OC will provide bottles for personal refreshments and adhesive labels at the SIC. The athletes may also be able to use their own bottles.

Team officials are permitted to hand over the personal refreshments to their athletes at the Refreshment Stations but are not allowed to leave the designated area to follow the athletes on the course. Two (2) officials from each delegation will have access to the Refreshment Station. The special passes to access the Refreshment Station will be distributed at the TIC.

In the Drinking / Sponging Station the OC will provide the non-refrigerated water in sealed bottles and wet sponges.

On the first and last Table in the Refreshment Station the OC will provide the non-refrigerated water in sealed bottles.

It is prohibited to obtain food, water, ice, etc. from the places other than the Refreshment Station and the Drinking / sponging Station.

Toilets will be available at the end of the Refreshment Station and the Drinking / Sponge Station.

There shall be two mist stations along the course. The water is sprayed from above. The athletes may choose whether to use the

mist stations at discretion.

First-aid stations and ambulances will be available at the start / finish areas and the turning points.

There are signs 100 meters in front of the Refreshment station, Drinking/Sponging station, Mist station, First-aid station, Toilet and every 5km Timing point.

6.3.5. Combined Events

a. The Men's Decathlon shall be held on two consecutive 24-hour Periods in the following order:

Day 1: 100m, Long Jump, Shot Put, High Jump, 400m.

Day 2: 110m Hurdles, Discus Throw, Pole Vault, Javelin Throw, 1,500m.

b. The Women's Heptathlon shall be held on two consecutive 24-hour Periods in the following order:

Day 1: 100m Hurdles, High Jump, Shot Put, 200m.

Day 2: Long Jump, Javelin Throw, 800m.

The latest World Athletics Combined Events scoring Tables will be applied.

6.3.6. Relay Races

All delegations must submit the list of athletes entered in the relay race to the TIC in accordance with the order of legs at least one hour before the commencement of the 1st heat of the race. Once a relay team has started in a competition, up to a total of four(4) additional athletes may be used as substitutes in the composition of the team.

6.3.7. Withdrawal

Withdrawal from competition, a formal withdrawal form must be completed and submitted to the TIC.

6.3.8. Call Room Procedure

- The Final Call Room for events other than the throws and road events is located in place between the Warm-up Area and the FOP with clear signs. Athletes will be ushered into it by Technical Official or volunteers.
- The First Call Room for throws is located in the Warm-up Area at Tanghu Middle School, and dedicated bus will be arranged nearby for transporting athletes to the Final Call Room of the Shuangliu Sports Center.
- The Call Room for road events is adjacent to the start area of the Half Marathon and the 20km Walk.
- Athletes taking part in Combined Events shall report to the Final Call Room before the first event of each day. The roll-calling procedures for the subsequent events will be carried out in the athlete lounge of Combined Events before the start of each event. The Referee for combined events will inform athletes the competition timetable in advance. Access to the combined events lounge is limited to the competitors and up to one other accredited person per athlete (coach, doctor, etc.) who are in possession of the combined events lounge pass. These passes can be distributed at the TIC in the Stadium the day before the start of each combined event competition. The lounge shall be furnished with massage couch, beverage and refreshments. The results and accumulating scores of all events can be checked in the lounge.
- The athletes will be ushered from the Call Room to the FOP in accordance with the timeTable:

(Athletes participating in throwing events need to go through the First Call Room at Tanghu Middle School then taking the dedicated bus to the final call room.)

f. The procedures in the Call Room will be as follows:

- to confirm the accreditation card and bibs.
- to check the athlete's uniform.
- to inspect the personal belongings and prohibited items.
- to check the athlete's shoes.
- to check any other kind of advertising.

Team Leaders must ensure that all their athletes comply with the above requirements before entering the Call Room. After completion of these procedures, athletes must follow the instructions given by the officials at the Call Room before being taken onto the Field of Play.

g. In accordance with World Athletics Rule 6 (TR6.3), personal belongings (camera, recording equipment, radio, CD player, radio transmitters, MP3/MP4, mobile phone and similar items) are not allowed to bring into the FOP, Call Room judges will temporarily keep them and provide athletes with receipt. After the competition, they may take back these items from the Post

Event Control Centre by presenting those receipt. At the end of each competition day, uncollected items will be stored at the TIC.

h. A specific Call Room Schedule will be produced for each session of competition and published on the notice boards at the SIC, as well as the TIC and in the Warm-up Area. The exact roll-calling time for each event will be displayed.

Competitors who fail to show up on time at the relevant Call Room without a reasonable cause (e.g. a medical certificate delivered by the official doctor of the FISU World University Games) shall be excluded from participating in this and all further events in the athletics competition of FISU World University Games, including relays.

i. Accreditation Cards for competing athletes will be collected at the Call Room and returned upon the completion of their respective events at the Post Event Control Centre.

j. Team officials and escorts are not allowed to enter the Call Room.

6.3.9. Pre-competition Procedures

a. Field events: each athlete participating in field events may have at least two practice trials at the FOP, which will be in draw order.

b. Track events: The athletes shall keep their clothing and backpacks in the Final Call Room and take them back from the Post Event Control Centre after the competition.

6.3.10. Start commands

The commands of the Starter shall be given in English.

a. The commands in races up to and including 400m and 4x400m relay shall be:

- On your marks

- Set

- Firing of the starting gun.

b. The commands in races of 800m and over shall be:

- On your marks

- Firing of the starting gun.

6.3.11. Sport Presentation

All athletes will be introduced by lane/order in the semi-final or final competition in track events and the final of field events.

6.3.12. Leaving the FOP

During the competition, an athlete shall inform the chief Judge before leaving the competition area and cannot leave without being accompanied by judge (s). In the field events, the athletes who have achieved the qualifying standard and advanced into the final and those who have been eliminated in the finals of High Jump and Pole

Vault shall be led by the relevant judges to leave the FOP for the Post Competition Control Center after the competition of each round or each height. The top three athletes shall leave competition area together.

6.3.13. Mixed Zone

All athletes must leave the competition area through the Mixed Zone, which is adjacent to the finish line (on the right side) and will be clearly indicated. The Mixed Zone for Race Walking and Half Marathon will be behind the finish line.

6.3.14. Post Event Control Centre

Athletes may receive their personal belongings and accreditation cards at the Post Event Control Centre. The items kept in the Final Call Room will be returned to the athletes there. The doping

control chaperons will complete the official notices with the athletes concerned, and escort the latter to the Doping Control Center.

The top three athletes will be ushered by a designated person waiting for the Medal Ceremony.

6.3.15. Disqualification

In accordance with the World Athletics Technical Rules Article 4.4 (TR4.4.), any explanation for the reason of failure in taking part in competition must be approved by the TCC.

An athlete shall be excluded from participation in all further events (including other events in which they are simultaneously participating) in the competition, including relays, in following cases:

a. final confirmation was given that the athlete would start in an event but then failed to participate;

Note: A fixed time for the final confirmation of participation shall be published in advance.

b. an athlete qualified in any Qualification Round of an event for further participation in that event but then failed to participate further.

6.3.16. Results

Official results will be displayed on the stadium scoreboard. All the results, as well as the next day's program, will be available on the noticeboard at the TIC in the Shuangliu Sport Center Stadium. The printed results will be available after each day's session at the SIC in the FISU Games Village .

6.3.17. Coaches Area

The coaches area is located at the designated seats at the front row, adjacent to the FOPs of field events, easy to communication

between coaches and athletes. Based on athletes' Final Confirmation, one ticket for the coach of each participating athlete will be distributed at the TIC for him/her to enter the Coaches Area.

6.4. Sport Entries and Eligibility

6.4.1.

Only delegations with athletes will be approved as official delegations participating in the FISU World University Games. (cf. Article 5.2 of The Entry Deadlines in the Regulations for the Chengdu 2021 FISU Games) are as follow:

6.10. Technical Officials

The list of ITOs will be provided in the Final version of the Technical Handbook to be published on 20 July 2023.

6.11. Protest and Appeal

Protests and Appeals will be handled in accordance with the Regulations for the Chengdu 2021 FISU Games and the World Athletics Technical Rules Article 8 (TR8) an extract of which appears below. Protests and appeals will be handled by the TIC at the Shuangliu Sport Center Stadium.

6.11.1. Protest

Protests concerning the result or conduct of an event shall be made within 30 minutes of the official announcement of the result of that event.

The OC will be responsible for ensuring that the time of the announcement of all results is recorded.

Any protest shall be made orally to the Referee by an athlete, by someone acting on his/her behalf, or by an official representative of a delegation. Such person or team may protest only if they are competing in the same round of the event to which the protest (or subsequent appeal) relates.

To arrive at a fair decision, the Referee should consider any available evidence that he or she thinks necessary, including a film or picture produced by an official video recorder, or any other available video evidence. The Referee may decide on the

protest or may refer the matter to the Jury. If the Referee makes a decision, there shall be a right of appeal to the Jury. Where the Referee is not accessible or available, the protest should be made to him through the TIC.

Note: The relevant Referee shall, after his decision on a protest, immediately inform the TIC of the time of the decision. If the Referee was unable to communicate this orally to the relevant delegation (s) / athlete (s), the official time of the announcement will be that of posting the decision at the TIC.

6.11.2. Appeal

An appeal to the Jury of Appeal must be made within 30 minutes:

- of the official announcement of the amended result of an event arising from the decision made by the Referee; or
- of the advice being given to those making the protest, where there is no amendment of any result.

It shall be in writing, signed by the athlete, by someone acting on his/ her behalf or by an official representative of a delegation and shall be accompanied by a deposit of USD 100, which will be forfeited if the appeal is not upheld. Such athlete or team may appeal only if they are competing in the same round of the event to which the appeal relates. Any decision of the Jury of Appeal is final and must be reported immediately to the Head of Delegation of the country/region concerned.

6.12. Late-Athlete Replacement Policy

Late entries will only be accepted in special circumstances and with the approval of FISU. In the event that an athlete gets injured or ill, the late-athlete replacement policy applies.

6.13. Equipment and Uniforms

6.13.1. Sport equipment

The sport equipment used for track and field events of Chengdu 2021 FISU Games need to be certified by World Athletics, and provided by the OC.

The OC will provide basic equipment for training and warm up practices. The throwing implements provided by the OC are shown below:

The athletes meeting the following conditions are entitled to use their own throwing implements:

- The throwing implements have been certified by World Athletics.
- The throwing implements are not in the list of throwing implements provided by the OC.
- The throwing implements are in good condition and their brands are easy to identify.
- The throwing implements are available for use by all athletes till the end of final.
- The throwing implements must be delivered to the personal equipment storage room at the Shuangliu Sport Center Stadium before 19:00 one day prior to the start of competition.

6.13.2.Vaulting Pole

The OC will provide the athletes with vaulting poles transportation and keeping services. All vaulting poles shall be marked by athletes with their names and the name of their country or region.

The athletes arriving at the Chengdu Tianfu International Airport and deposit their vaulting poles at the 'Arrival & Departure Service Desk' of the Chengdu Tianfu International Airport and receive a receipt from the OC. The vaulting poles will be transported from the Chengdu Tianfu International Airport to the Athletics Training Field A(Track and Jumping) at Chengdu University, and to the FOP of Shuangliu Sports Centre one day before the event, and back to the 'Arrival & Departure Service Desk' of the Chengdu Tianfu International Airport after the event, where the athletes take back their vaulting poles by presenting the receipt.

6.13.3.Markers

No athlete will be allowed to use his/her own markers.

The OC will provide each athlete with two markers for the events of Long Jump, Triple Jump, Pole Vault and Javelin Throw.

For High Jump, athletes will be provided with two adhesive tapes. Each athlete can only use one marker in the relay events, as per the World Athletics Technical Rule 24.4. These will be distributed in the Call Room.

For Shot Put, Discus Throw and Hammer Throw one marker may be used according to World Athletics Technical Rule 25.3.2.

No chalk powder or pen markers are to be used on any runway.

6.13.4.Clothing

Competing athletes must wear the official uniform of sport federation of their country/region, otherwise they are not allowed to access the FOP and take part in competition.

Before entering the FOP, the clothing will be checked at the final Call Room.

At 12:00PM one day before the GTM (29 July, 2023), all delegations must submit photos of their competition uniforms (including vests, shorts, tights and athletic garments) on a USB stick to the SIC.

- JPEG files (maximum resolution and size: 300dpi/500kb)
- Preferably compressed ZIP files.
- The file name must clearly indicate the name of country or region.

This rule applies to competition uniforms (including vests, shorts and tights) and athletic garments.

The OC will comply with detailed stipulations of World Athletics Rule

5 (CR5), World Athletics Advertising Regulations and detailed stipulations on competition clothing in the Regulations. The dressing requirements in the Call Room and the FOP during the

competition shall be consistent with the Regulations. Those who do not comply with World Athletics Regulations are not allowed to enter the FOP.

6.13.5. Shoes

Athletes are only allowed to wear World Athletics certified shoes.

a. Spikes: Any number of spikes up to 11 may be used but the number of spike positions shall not exceed 11. Each spike shall not exceed 12mm except in the High Jump and Javelin Throw, otherwise it shall not exceed 9mm. The spike must be so constructed that it will, at least for the half of its length closest to the tip, fit through a square sided 4mm gauge.

6.13.6. Athlete Bibs

Each athlete shall be provided with four bibs which, during the competition, shall be worn visibly on the front of the torso and back, on the back of the track suits, and on the sports bags,

except in the Jumping Events, where one bib may be worn on the front of the torso or back only. These bibs must be worn as issued and may not be cut, folded or obscured in any way.

In Relay Races, any athlete of each delegation must wear on his/her chest a bib marked with a three-letter country/region code, and on his/her back an individual bib.

In Track Events, the athletes will be also given two adhesive hip numbers in the Call Room before entering the Field of Play. The hip numbers must be secured to both sides of the athlete's shorts / legs. In Relay Races, the hip bib shall only be distributed by the judge at the takeover zone to the last athlete of each delegation.

In Combined Events, the athlete with the highest scores will be provided with one leading bib, which shall be worn on the chest and distributed by the Combined Events referee at the Combined Events lounge.

All participating teams are required to verify whether the above requirements have been met in order to prevent from delay of competitions.

6.14. Doping Control

6.14.1.

To ensure health, fairness and equality of athletes, doping control will be conducted for the Games, during which any athlete may need to undergo testing (including urine test, blood test and dry blood spot test) at any time.

6.14.2.

The athlete who has been notified by duly authorised personnel for doping control shall cooperate. Any athlete who evades, refuses or fails to complete sample collection will be suspected

of doping offence.

6.14.3.

Athletes and auxiliary personnel shall understand and abide by all applicable anti-doping policies and rules of the World Anti-Doping Code and the FISU Anti-Doping Regulations. All doping control standards will be in strict accordance with relevant rules of FISU, TIC and WADA.

6.15. Awards and Medals

A grand and solemn medal ceremony will be held after each after each final.

6.15.1. Medal Ceremony

- a. The top three ranked athletes must attend the medal ceremony.
- b. Ten minutes prior to the ceremony, the medallists will be ushered to the waiting area by the venue sport team coordinator. In the event that a medalist is unable to attend, the medal will be delivered to an official of the relevant delegation who must be dressed in the delegation's official outfit. He/she must not mount the podium but stand behind it.
- c. The medallists are expected to mount the podium in the official team uniforms. However, they are allowed to attend the official ceremony wearing sports uniforms when the ceremony takes place immediately after the competition. The medallists are not allowed to take any National/Regional flag or any other Country/Region, cultural or religious symbol on the podium. They must not wear hats, caps or sunglasses on the podium.
- d. The National/Regional flag will be raised for medallists and FISU anthem will be played. All medallists and relevant officials are required to face the flags while they are being raised and the FISU anthem is being played.

- e. After the flag-raising ceremony, medallists are expected to take photos with award presenters and then with other medallists.
- f. After photos are taken, the medalists shall proceed to the mixed zone/new for interview and then escorted by the venue sport team staff.
- g. Any dispute regarding protocol will be resolved by FISU.

6.15.2. Medals and Mascot

The athletes/teams of the top three places in the finals will be awarded a gold medal, a silver medal and a bronze medal and mascots, respectively. If more than four athletes of a single delegation compete in the semi-final or final of a relay event, only four athletes entering the final competition will attend the medal ceremony, and the rest of the athletes will receive their medals from the TIC. All members of the Race Walk and Half Marathon teams will attend the medal ceremony and receive medals.

6.15.3. Diploma

Diplomas will be awarded in accordance with the FISU Protocol. Please refer to Art. 6.2.2 of the Chengdu 2021 FISU Games General Regulations.

6.15.4. Other awards

No other awards shall be given unless agreed otherwise with FISU.

6.16. Media Interviews

Media centres are set up in all competition venues to facilitate interviews and reports by the accredited media.

After the competitions, all athletes must exit the field of play

through the mixed zone, where they will be interviewed by the media.

Athletes will be guided by the OC staff to the press conference room, to attend the press conference after the medal ceremony.

All press conferences will be supported with English and Chinese interpreting services.






